Ability <i>This refers to the ability to perform the work tasks and activities required of the occupation, and the ability to react to and manage the changes at work.</i>	The ability to: ● Collect information from clients for suitable home and community integration activities in accordance with organisational procedure. ● Check medical conditions of clients in accordance with organisational procedure. ● Brainstorm and identify suitable home and community integration activities for clients under their care in consultation with therapist. ● Suggest suitable duration, date, time and location for community integration activities in accordance with organisational procedure. ● Recce location and study for route and environmental condition (eg terrain, lighting and weather) as required-in accordance with organisational procedure. ● Plan contingency for weather conditions and unforeseen circumstances in accordance with organisational procedure.
Person-Centred Care <i>This refers to having a person centred care mind set to drive the care giver to respect and recognise the decisions/choices of the person they are taking care of.</i>	Underlying principles: ● Treating clients with dignity and respect by being aware of and supporting personal perspectives, values, beliefs, culture and preferences; respecting their privacy while encouraging independence of the individual; and listening to each other and working in partnership to design and deliver services ● To be mindful of client's need of reassurance
Performance Outcome <i>This refers to the outcome of the task on the care recipient as indication of workplace success</i>	● The support care staff is able to assist plan community integration activities in a manner that is respectful of client's dignity, taking into consideration his/her condition, preferences and comfort level.
